

# **Picturing Economics**

## Description

Students are actively engaged as they illustrate their understanding of a concept before the concept has been introduced in the classroom. At the end of the allotted time for the activity, each group explains their masterpiece.



#### **Materials**

- Piece of chart tablet (1 per each group of 4-5 participants)
- Marker (1 per group of 4-5 participants)
- 30-second timer

### **Teacher Preparation**

Post chart tablets on wall around the room.

#### **Procedure**

- 1. Divide participants into groups of four to five. Distribute one marker to each group.
- 2. Explain the activity:
  - Everyone knows a picture is worth a thousand words, so our task today is to picture ECONOMICS. For
    the activity, only pictures and symbols may be added to the final piece. We are creating a nonlinguistic
    representation (http://www.ascd.org/publications/educational-leadership/may10/vol67/num08/Representing-Knowledge-Nonlinguistically.aspx).
  - The person holding the marker will be the first artist.
  - After 30 seconds, the marker will be passed to the next person in the group.
  - He/she may add on to the picture/symbol being illustrated or add a completely different picture/symbol.
  - Participants will continue to pass the marker and add to the final piece until time is called.
  - Each group will be asked to share their piece with the group and explain how they picture Economics.
