### **Are You One of the Lucky Ones?**

ECONOMICS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

If you are teaching the required High School Economics Course this spring semester, you are one of the lucky ones! Economics Arkansas and the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis have wonderful resources available to teach the 18-week course, whether they are used as primary or secondary sources. You can access the "Tools for Teaching Economics" semester course notebook here.

However, before you begin the course, please consider visiting the Fed's website and having your students take

the Economics Pre-Test (available soon!). You will need to create an account if you don't already have one. Then you simply set up your classrooms with students and ensure you check the box next to "Add Arkansas Assessments to Class." When you add students, the system automatically generates usernames and passwords for each student so they can login and take tests, watch videos, review lessons you've selected for them. All activity generated by students is there for your viewing and recording.

When the semester concludes, you can have students take the Economics Post-Test and quantify the learning that took place. In addition, you will have great data to include in your PGP! 

## Arkansas Reads One Book

Economics Arkansas is pleased to be assisting with a Family Financial Literacy Initiative for grades K-5 in partnership with One District One Book. Approximately 10 school districts in Arkansas will be participating this spring. The premise of this initiative is for schools and families to read "The Lemonade War" book together
